  equipment in new or renovated buildings that they own. The Code Section 179D
  incentive can now be taken on a specific commercial building every 3 years
  rather than permitted once over the life of the building. Learn more about the
  Code Section 179D incentive
- New Inflation Reduction Act Provisions Allow State, Local, and Tribal Governments, Non-profits, U.S. Territories, Rural Energy Co-ops, and more to access tax credits for building a Clean Energy Economy. This Act now provides quicker, more affordable building, creating more clean energy projects, allowing more communities to benefit from the growth of the clean energy economy.
