The National Climate Action Strategy for Libraries provides a clear direction on where emphasis is necessary to move beyond good intentions to meaningful impacts, focusing on three areas:

- **Climate Mitigation** (reduction of greenhouse gas emissions)
- Climate Adaptation (helping people, institutions, and communities thrive in the face of climate change)
- Climate Justice (increasing the empathy, respect, and understanding we have of all community members)

This document outlines the strategy, followed by advice and resources, to aid libraries of all types - public, academic, school, consortia, and special libraries - in their tactical implementation of this strategy.


