The <u>Highland Public Library</u> was officially Certified Sustainable in December 2021. In August they received their one-of-a-kind Sustainable Libraries Initiative certification plaque. They will be celebrating their achievement at their library in the near future. We hope that the plaque is displayed proudly because we are more than proud of them for the hard work they did to achieve their certification! Our plaques are designed and fabricated in Ridgway, Colorado by a company called Kiitella, which is a sustainability-oriented small business that sources only the highest quality materials. Each plaque is made out of reclaimed barn wood and recycled steel, which are both sourced locally, so no two plaques are exactly the same!


SLI WEBINAR: HOSTING A REPAIR CAFE

The Sustainable Libraries Initiative welcomes four new Advisory Board members. Claudia Depkin, Dr. Jen Cannell, Jen Ferriss, and Margaret Woodruff. Claudia is the Director of Haverstraw King's Daughters Public Library. Her involvement and enthusiasm as a cocreator of the SLI have had a role in shaping what this organization has become. Dr. Jen Cannell has been involved with the SLI for many years. She was instrumental in developing the School Librarian Certification Benchmarks and is a mentor for the School Librarian and Academic Library Programs, len Ferriss is the Assistant Director of the Saratoga Springs Public Library. She was a cocreator of the SLCP and led Saratoga Springs to be one of the first Certified Sustainable Libraries. She has continued to be a vocal advocate for the SLI from her early work writing our newsletter to her role as a speaker and representative for the SLI at numerous conferences and webinars including our upcoming Hosting a Repair Cafe' Webinar. Margaret Woodruff is the Director of the Charlotte Library in Charlotte, VT.

The dedication of time and energy by our new and current board members is instrumental to our continued success.
