
The latest Library Journal

Congratulations, Brentwood Public Library!

Brentwood Public Library, located in Suffolk County, NY is officially a "Certified Sustainable Library." They have completed the Sustainable Library Certification Program, which is a step-by-step benchmarking program designed for libraries to build a strong foundation of sustainable thinking at every level of their organization. They are the thirteenth library nationwide to achieve this certification and the eighth in Suffolk County, NY.

They have demonstrated a strong commitment to sustainable environmental practices and shown the benefits of connections to their community throughout the certification process. An impressive 450-panel solar array has produced over 800 Megawatts of renewable electricity. They broadcast this and other environmentally sound practices to their community through the <u>Green Library</u> page on their website. Continued community engagement has resulted in many partnerships and services being offered through the library such as English language classes and hosting legal aid organizations on a regular basis.

Gardiner Library

Earlier this month, <u>Gardiner Library</u> brought back their annual craft supplies sale for the first time since 2019. This popular fundraiser for the library is organized with donations of craft supplies from the community. This allows local

crafters to downsize their stash and benefit the library (and the environment) at the same time. This year's donated items included supplies for knitting, jewelry making, scrapbooking, sewing, needle crafts, and kids crafting. Local yarn shops and hardware stores also donated to help this fundraiser. Gardiner publicized the event through local news sources and social media. Their Instagram account's numerous "Can you guess...?" posts generated interest and built up the excitement for this event. With a team of volunteers running the event and assisting shoppers, Gardiner raised \$11,000.
