Abstract

Public libraries exist across every state and territory in the United States and are charged with serving the public good, including community lifelong learning needs, inclusive of STEM education. In this context, the profession of librarianship has developed new thinking to articulate how public libraries can embrace the core value of sustainability, including a National Climate Action Strategy for Libraries. This strategy calls on public libraries to harness the transformative power of education for climate justice by developing relationships with local community organizations. This report introduces the framework that has been developed around this topic, some of the work individual public libraries have accomplished, and opportunities for enhanced collaboration to ensure public libraries are fully included in strategies focused on critical climate actions. The report argues that libraries are the special ingredient, found in every community across the country, that climate action plans need to actualize the buy-in, collaboration, and energy that will bring them to life.

Sustainable Libraries Initiative President and co-founder Rebekkah Smith Aldrich published a report for STAR Library Network: a division of the *Space Science Institute* designed to expand the knowledge of science, engineering, technology, and mathematics within the community of library professionals.

The report, titled *Public Libraries are Critical Agencies in Multi-Sector Climate Action Plans, Policies, and Actions*, argues that libraries are frontrunning organizations in the battle to build community resiliency against climate change.

Five Years of Impact from Six Cleanup Campaigns

Since 2018, a total of 211 countries and territories, which includes 95% of UN member states, have engaged 91M participants, equal to 1.13% of the global population, removing 543,704 tons of mismanaged waste from our environment.

Beginning in 2024, World Cleanup Day has been officially added to the United Nation's calendar of International Days and Weeks to be celebrated annually on September 20th.
