## **SLI UPDATCS** The SLI Partners with The Association of Research Libraries



The Association of Research Libraries, a nonprofit membership organization of select research libraries and archives in the US and Canada, has partnered with the Sustainable Libraries Initiative to help bring sustainability resources to their members and exemplify their core value of sustainability in accordance with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals.

With this partnership, the ARL becomes the first nationwide partnership for the SLI and aims to invite more academic libraries to the table in discussions about climate action and social equity work -- providing evidence that libraries of all kinds, shapes, and sizes have the potential to make a difference and be leaders in the fight against environmental issues.

"We are excited for this opportunity to partner with ARL and more deeply connect with the research library community," said Rebekkah Smith Aldrich, Co-Founder and President of the Sustainable Libraries Initiative, "ARL's commitment to advance an equitable, enduring, research environment dovetails wonderfully with the SLI's mission to empower library leaders to intentionally address climate change through their work and co-create thriving communities. We think this partnership will supercharge this work across the academic library community and therefore campuses across North America."

# The Virginia Library Association Becomes the SLI's Sixth State Association Partnership



The Sustainable Libraries Initiative has partnered with the Virginia Library Association to bring a wealth of resources to their members in the movement to build resilient communities and combat the impacts of climate change and social injustice.

Following in the footsteps of Iowa, Maine, Massachusetts, New Jersey, and New York, the Virginia Library Association signed an agreement to collaborate with the Sustainable Libraries Initiative for a minimum of one year: providing valuable resources such as sustainable tools, webinars, vendors, program ideas, and educational materials.

### Three SLI Academic Institutions Recognized by AASHE in the 2024 Sustainable Campus Index



The Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE) recently released their annual Sustainable Campus Index: a document highlighting and ranking colleges and universities across the world on the basis of sustainable practices.

Several institutions with libraries currently participating in the Sustainable Library Certification Program were celebrated by the index in recognition of their broader campus achievements.

San Diego State University was ranked #5 in the *Curriculum* section for "developing and offering learning opportunities in sustainability;" The University of Maryland was ranked #5 in the *Waste* section for "waste minimization and reduction construction, waste diversion, and hazardous waste management;" and Cal Poly Humboldt was ranked #5 in the *Investment & Finance* section for "sustainable investment, committees for responsible investing, and investment disclosure" as well as #4 in the *Overall Top Performers (Master's Institutions)* category.

In addition, **Cal Poly Humboldt** was also recognized as one of the first institutions in the United States -- alongside Bard College -- to earn a Plastic Reduction Partner Certification from the National Wildlife Federation's *Campus Race to Zero Waste*.

The Sustainable Libraries Initiative is proud to see the achievements of these academic institutions acknowledged and congratulates them for work well done. We are delighted to be considered by these institutions as a resource to bring them closer to their goals.

### ALA Awards the School Library Systems Association of New York State for Sustainable Initiatives

"The American Library Association (ALA) is pleased to announce that the School Library Systems Association of New York State is the 2024 winner of the EBSCO Information Services Library Staff Development Award for their proposal, *School Library Sustainability*.

The award consists of \$3,500 and a 24k gold-framed citation. It is given to a library organization whose application demonstrates greatest merit for a program of staff development designed to further the goals and objectives of the library organization....Their award-winning project is to host a virtual statewide professional workshop to empower school librarians to join the Sustainable Library Certification Program (SLCP). The certification process encourages reflective practice, leadership development, peer mentoring, networking, community building, and, most importantly, sustainable school library programs across New York State.

Their proposal addresses two needs: increasing the impact of school librarians on student achievement by increasing the number of sustainable school library programs. This project matches SLSA's mission to 'To strengthen, support and advocate for our members as they foster quality school library programs.' Helping school library programs become sustainable will strengthen community support for libraries despite retirements or staff changes.

The target group for this project is any interested librarian in New York State. Still, encouragement will be given by SLSA Directors to those new to the profession as they have the most years of service to students ahead of them."
