

With student-driven efforts to create a positive impact and their own sustainability librarian implementing sustainability into the curriculum, California State Polytechnic University Humboldt campus is a leader in sustainability.

The Sustainable Humboldt Innovative Futures Trust (SHIFT) committee, supported by faculty representative and sustainability librarian Morgan Barker, sets out to implement projects accelerating progress towards a greener, more equitable future on campus. With funding from student fees, some of the initiatives the SHIFT committee helped bring to campus include a small solar array, lighting upgrades, water bottle refill stations, and compost bins, among many others.

"Centered in the campus Sustainability Office, this committee is a spot where the perspective of a Librarian is sincerely useful, as effective research models support active student learning, especially when it comes to the nuance of sustainability elements. Having a Librarian out there, with students, brings Library services into the campus community," says Morgan.

Recently, the committee worked with the OhSnap! Food Pantry on campus to purchase a sustainable vehicle after the pantry expressed a need to expand its services. The group engaged in an open dialogue with the grantee, sought out data from facilities on purchasing options, and carefully considered alignment with the fund's goals when coming to a decision. After weighing the options, a hybrid pick-up truck was chosen -- exemplifying the importance of hands-on student work in bridging the gap between climate literacy and climate action.

Mira Friedman, Lead for Health Education and Clinic Support Services, expressed gratitude for the purchase:

"Dear SHIFT... Today we were able to help a student move from Motel 8 back to campus using our hybrid truck. We were able to use just the truck because my crew, the student and her friend all were able to all pile in and do just one trip. We were also able to load the back with food and other supplies she needed from some stores. We were able to get into RWC storage and load her up with recent supplies we picked up from the Samoa warehouse from move out donations. Lots of clothes, kitchen appliances, dishes, silverware, hangers, shelving unit, bathroom caddy, and so much more. If we didn't have the truck it would have taken additional cars to make this possible. Thank you for supporting our efforts! We appreciate you all! It was a good day."

Sustainable Librarianship: Core Competencies and Practices

Climate change and environmental destruction are a code red for humanity and are this generation's grandest challenge. In 2019, ALA Council added "Sustainability" as a core value of the profession, adopting the triple bottom line definition of sustainability to ensure balanced decision-making that respects environmental stewardship, social equity, and economic feasibility. As community leaders and facilitators, libraries should be modeling sustainable practices among their staff and within their facilities.



In this special eCourse, Rebekkah Smith Aldrich, President of the Sustainable Libraries Initiative, will lead you through the principles and practices of sustainable librarianship along with a group of expert speakers, lecturers, and writers.

After participating in this course:

- Students will have a strong understanding of the "triple bottom line" definition of sustainability as adopted by the American Library Association as a Core Value of Librarianship.
- Students will be able to accurately describe operational decisions, services, programs, and partnerships their library is already undertaking that better position their institutions as sustainability leaders
- Using the "sustainable thinking" model, students will be able to make operational decisions as well as design new services, programs, and partnerships to ensure their institutions are relevant and responsive in the face of the impacts of climate change.
- Students will understand the importance of equity, diversity, and inclusion in the context of climate justice.

This 4-week asynchronous eCourse will begin on Monday, March 10, 2025, and end on Sunday, April 6, 2025.

First, librarians from Maine's Belfast Free Library won an IMLS grant to fund the All of Belfast: Climate Dialogues. The program engaged a broad range of Belfast residents in conversations about climate change and documented the communities' ideas and priorities for climate action. Next, Mt. Vernon, WA's former mayor will tell us about the Mt. Vernon Library Commons, a \$53 million project funded by several federal grants. The space includes a children's library, public kitchen, community center, and electric vehicle charging stations. The project has been lauded for its sustainability elements and for the amenities it brings to a disadvantaged community. This webinar will also highlight the EJ TCTAC program, through which municipalities, tribes and community-based organizations can access free technical assistance to win funding and make meaningful environmental progress locally.
