

As part of their <u>Green Business Partnership</u> Certification, <u>Longwood Public Library</u> highlighted their use of natural light in their building. The combination of natural light, overhead, and task lighting is a flexible way to use only the energy you need to illuminate your public spaces.

The <u>Shelter Island Public Library</u> partners with a local non-profit, the <u>Sylvester Manor Educational Farm</u> for the <u>Shelter Island Seed Library</u>. They also collaborate to offer children's story times during farm stand hours and programming such as Introduction to Vegetable Gardening.

In July the <u>Highland Public Library</u> hosted a free seminar series as part of the <u>UCCRA</u>

<u>Zero Waste Seminar Project</u>. These sessions aimed to raise awareness of the environmental consequences of single use plastics, pollution, and waste on our health as individuals and communities. One of the partners in this series, the <u>New York State</u>

<u>Pollution Prevention Institute</u>, has additional on- demand <u>webinars</u> available on their website.
